# PROTECT YOUR PERSONAL PROPERTY

#### FOLLOW THESE THEFT PREVENTION TIPS FROM McGRUFF:

When traveling, lock your vehicle at all times, especially when you stop at a gas station, rest area, or other public place.

Keep your personal electronics laptop, GPS system, MP3 player, camera, cell phone — out of sight or locked in the trunk of your vehicle.

Keep a record of the serial

numbers of all your valuable items.

Don't carry large amounts of cash or flash expensive items.

Carry only the personal information, cash, and credit cards you need, and keep them secure in your wallet or purse.

If you discover that something has been stolen, report it to local law enforcement.

### BE WISE ABOUT SCAMS

#### FOLLOW McGRUFF'S PREVENTION TIPS FOR THE YOUNG AT HEART:

Be wary of strangers in your neighborhood offering services or asking for money.

Be skeptical of bargain home repair offers if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.

Don't let yourself get pressured into signing a contract or giving a verbal agreement.

Don't give personal information to people you don't know unless you initiated the contact.

Get estimates, ask for references, and never pay for products or services in advance.

If you suspect fraud from a door-to-door salesperson, get the driver's license plate number and call law enforcement immediately.

### HELP YOUR KIDS BE SAFE AT SCHOOL

FOLLOW THESE SCHOOL VIOLENCE PREVENTION TIPS FROM McGRUFF:

Talk to your children about the dangers of weapons at school.

Place your computer where you can see what your child is doing.

Learn how your children are using the Internet by regularly checking frequented sites and monitoring how much time they spend online.
